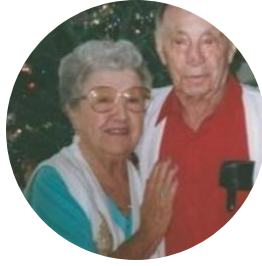

LOUISE DAVIS KIENLE, age 96, was born in Valisburg, New Jersey 1916. She was a Baptist. Preceded in death by her beloved husband, Charles (2002). Moved to Florida in 1976 to Pointe West. She retired from Bayer Pharma Corp Human Resources where she was the payroll supervisor for 16 years. Involved in music all her life, she studied piano, vocal, dance, also choral with Fred Waring. Volunteered with the Billy Graham Choir & USO in New York during the 2nd World War. She also was a contralto soloist at many New Jersey churches. In Florida, Louise's volunteer work included volunteering in the first gift shop, and buyer for the Bayonet Point Regional Hospital for seven (7) years; Summertree Library for twenty-five (25) years; Moon Lake Elementary Library; Pine Tree Library; Catholic Social Services of Pasco.
