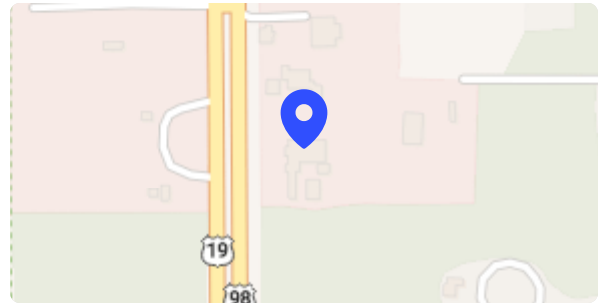

But real life is full of storms and without them we would not appreciate the rainbow or flowers. We had our share of storms but found a way to weather them and as a result become stronger. I love you dad and appreciate who you were and became and of the boys you raised to men and best friends. 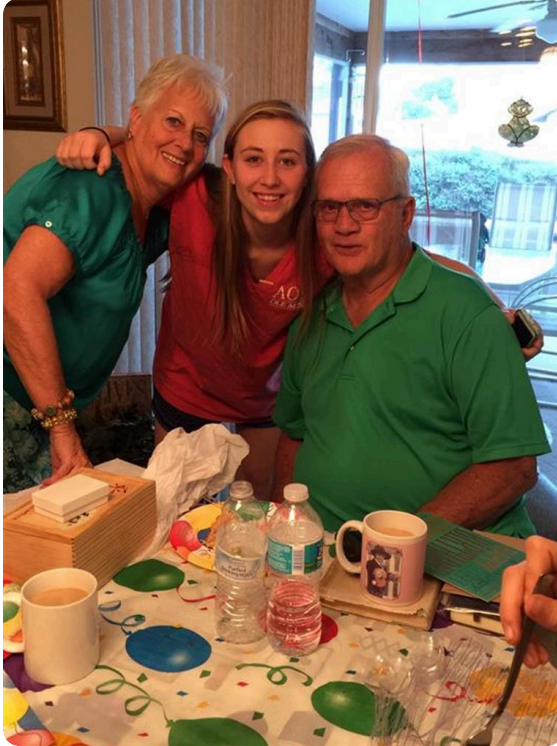
